Book

Author, A. B. *Title of Book*, 3rd ed.; Publisher: City, YYYY.

Edited book

Title of Book; Editor, A. B., Ed.; Publisher: City, YYYY.

Chapter

Author, A. B. Title of Chapter. In *Title of Book*; Editor, C. D., Ed.; Publisher: City, YYYY; pp 100–125.

Website

Author, A. B. Title of Page. Site Name.
<https://example.com/page> (accessed YYYY-MM-DD).

Patent

Inventor, A. B.; Inventor, C. D. Title of Patent. U.S. Patent 9,876,543, Month DD, YYYY.

Thesis

Author, A. B. Title of Dissertation. Ph.D. Dissertation, University Name, City, YYYY.

IN-TEXT CITATIONS

Superscript (most journals)	... as reported. ¹
Italic number on the line	... as reported (1).
Author and year	... as Kroto and co-workers reported (1985).
Two sources	... reported. ^{1,3}
A run of sources	... reported. ¹⁻⁴

WHAT IS BOLD, WHAT IS ITALIC

Bold	The publication year, and nothing else.
Italic	The journal abbreviation, the volume, and book titles.
Roman	Article titles, chapter titles, page numbers, publisher and place.
Order	Journal abbreviation, then year, then volume, then pages.

AUTHOR NAMES

Order	Surname first, then initials: Kroto, H. W.
Separator	A semicolon between authors, because the names contain commas.
All authors	ACS names every author. There is no et al. cut-off in the reference list.
Editors	Editor, A. B., Ed. (one) or Eds. (several), inside the book reference.

SIX MISTAKES THAT COST MARKS

- Leaving the publication year unbolded.
- Truncating the author list with et al.
- Separating authors with commas instead of semicolons.
- Spelling journal names out in full.
- Writing pp. with a full stop in a chapter reference.
- Giving a web source no access date.
